Inala's Southwestern Australia

The Coral Coast and Outback Northern
Wheatbelt

Day 1

Thu 16 Oct 2025 Perth to Wongan Hills to Dalwallinu.

Breakfast at 06:30 and we departed the Ingot Hotel at 07:00. Australian White Ibis shortly after we left. We drove north out of Perth and turned north east to Toodyay. We stopped briefly about 10kms from Toodyay in some Wandoo woodland. Grey Fantail (*preissi*). Red-capped Parrot. Western Gerygone (*fusca*). Striated Pardalote (*substriatus*). Galah (*roseicapilla*). Brown Honeyeater (*indistincta*). Australian Raven (*perplexus*). Frank heard a few others.

At Toodyay we turned east to Goomalling. Past Goomalling, we turned north to Wongan Hills. We stopped just after the corner and saw our first Western Corella (*derbyi*) and Yellow-throated Miner (*wayensis*). Australian Magpie (*dorsalis*).

We stopped further along for some martins. Fairy Martin! Nesting in a culvert under the road. Some more Western Corella (*derbyi*) with at least one Little Corella (*westralensis*). We stopped at the arboretum 2kms south of Wongan Hills. Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater. Pied Butcherbird (*picatus*). Rufous Songlark. Singing Honeyeater (*virescens*). Laughing Dove (introduced). Willie Wagtail (*leucophrys*). Magpie-lark (*cyanoleuca*).

We spent a little time on the Christmas Rock Walk but saw little. We had an early lunch at a park in town. Welcome Swallow. Red Wattlebird (*woodwardi*).

After lunch (about 12:00), we continued to Reynoldson Reserve. Australian Pipit (*bilbali*). There were significant numbers of two species of grevillea flowering, but nothing on them. Several species of verticordia flowering. We continued north to where we saw some salt lakes. White-winged Fairywren (*leuconotus*). White-fronted Chat. Frank unfortunately left his iPhone on the bonnet.

We continued towards Ballidu and some other salt lakes had Australian Shelduck and Red-capped Plover. Black-faced Woodswallow (cinereus). Crested Pigeon (whitlocki). We headed north towards Pithara. We turned around to look at some swallows at the Kondut grain terminals. Welcome Swallow (carteri). This was where the iPhone fell off, but we didn't realise until shortly after. We backtracked looking for it without success. Thinking it might have picked up by a vehicle going the other way. But then it was found well and truly smashed up!

Just before the turn on to the Great Northern Highway, there were more flowering grevillea. There were 10+ White-fronted Honeyeater. Frank saw a Black Honeyeater fly off being chased by a White-fronted Honeyeater. Poor views of Splendid Fairywren (splendens).

We got to Dalwallinu and turned east towards Kalannie for 30kms. We made one stop. Welcome Swallow. Tree Martin (neglecta). Rufous Songlark (but it flew further away before we got great looks). The rear end of two Australian Zebra Finch flying away. We continued and saw a Spotted Harrier flying low over a canola field.

We turned around and checked in to the Dalwallinu Wheatfields Hotel at 17:20.

Day 2

Fri 17 Oct 2025 Dalwallinu to Paynes Find to Mt Magnet.

Breakfast in our rooms at 06:00. We departed shortly at 06:20. Welcome Swallow. Tree Martin. Grey Shrikethrush (rufiventris).

We drove 20kms to Wubin where we refuelled. We then headed east towards Paynes Find (154kms). Western Corella. Galah. Common Wallaroo. We stopped for Regent Parrot in some salmon gums. Striated Pardalote. We went 2kms along the Mt Gibson road to the sand pit. We heard Shy Heathwren (whitlocki) and distant Southern Scrub Robin and Crested Bellbird (gutturialis), but they didn't show. No sign of Red-backed Kingfisher. A pair of White-backed Swallow.

We then tried unsuccessfully along Wannara Road for Western Fieldwren. Square-tailed Kite was excellent. We heard Inland Thornbill (whitlocki) and possibly the fieldwren. The conditions looked excellent. It was 33C and warming up. We drove to Paynes Find. Whistling Kite.

We arrived at Paynes Find just after 10:00. We drove south along Maranalgo Road for 32km. Red-tailed Black Cockatoo (esconditus). The conditions were some of the best I have seen, but the bird activity was very limited. Brown Falcon (berigora) was common. We walked along the fence line. Brief views of a male Purple-backed Fairywren (assimilis). Two Slaty-backed Thornbill. Good views of a male Splendid Fairywren (splendens). We drove back. Very brief views of Red-capped Robin. Australian Pipit. A flock of 40+ Little Crow. Australian Magpie (longirostris). We stopped at the abandoned mine. Little Woodswallow (minor) and Peregrine Falcon (macropus) were very cooperative. Welcome Swallow. Eurasian Coot. Australasian Grebe (with two young). A Fairy Martin.

We had lunch at the Paynes Find Roadhouse. We left at 13:00 and drove 49kms east along the road to Sandstone to the Warne River crossing. 37C! A northerly breeze. We tried along the river. Extremely poor views of a Gilbert's Whistler. White-browed Babbler (*superciliosus*). White-fronted Honeyeater. Frank saw a Horsfield's Bronze Cuckoo fly away. Australian Zebra Finch (including young). We walked back through the open scrub. Hooded Robin (female *westralensis*). Red-capped Robin (two immatures). Brief views of male and female Crimson Chat. We drove back. Two Gould's Monitors crossed the road. A Crested (aka Bicycle) Dragon sprinted across the road. We stopped at the cattle grid at the 7km mark. Mulga Parrot.

We drove to Mt Magnet (143kms). We went a few kms along the road to Yalgoo to try for Western Quailthrush, but no success. It was still 38C.

We drove into Mt Magnet. Torresian Crow. We heard White-plumed Honeyeater (*carteri*) and Yellow-throated Miner. We checked in by 17:30. We went to the Commercial Club Hotel for dinner at 18:30. We were back shortly after 19:30.

Day 3

Sat 18 Oct 2025 Cue area.

Depart at 05:55. 22C. Yellow-throated Miner. Crested Pigeon. Tree Martin. Breakfast at the Swagman Roadhouse. Refuelled. Torresian Crow. We left for Cue (80kms) at 06:25. Wedge-tailed Eagle (*audax*). Little Crow.

At Cue, we turned west towards Austin Downs. Australian Hobby (*murchisonianus*). We turned left past the gold mine and birded the area near the cattle grid. Nothing at the small waterhole. Grey-crowned Babbler (*rubeculus*). We circled around seeing and hearing very little. A pair of Bourke's Parrots flew past. We went

back to the waterhole and they were there. Australian Zebra Finch. We walked back out. Excellent views of a female Western Quail-thrush. A very brief view of the male. Crested Pigeon. Australian Pipit.

We drove further towards Austin Downs. We failed to find the Banded Whiteface. We continued a little further. We started to realise how extremely dry everything was. We failed to identify anything. We drove further out past Austin Downs. A small group of birds. Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater. Rufous Whistler. We then turned left down a side road with pipes along the side. Very quiet. 32C. We turned around and stopped. Redthroat. Black-eared Cuckoo (which love to parasitise Redthroats).

We returned to Cue, taking a track to bypass the town. We headed north to Nallan Lake which was dry. We then drove along a track that eventually came to Millie Well. Very dry. 35C. Absolutely no ground cover. We heard Rufous Whistler but nothing else. No Hooded Robin. We then went to Milly Soak. White-plumed Honeyeater. We walked to the historic graves. A Collared Sparrowhawk (cirrocephala) flew past. Good views of a pair of Inland Thornbill (whitlocki). We drove back to the highway. Crested Bellbird. We then drove back to Cue for lunch. A Whistling Kite came to its nest on the phone tower.

We left town at 13:00 and drove down Lakeside Road. We tried unsuccessfully for Chiming Wedgebill. Great views of male and female Pied Honeyeater. Frank saw a female Black Honeyeater. We continued to Lake Austin. We walked nearly 500 metres along the edge of the lake looking for Rufous Fieldwren, Orange Chat and Slender-billed Thornbill. Nothing. The samphire has deteriorated to the point that it doesn't really offer any suitable habitat. It is probably not worth coming here anymore.

We drove back. We stopped for Chestnut-rumped Thornbill. Frank saw a female Red-capped Robin. Australian Pipit. We continued back past the mine. Nankeen Kestrel (cenchroides). We tried again unsuccessfully for Chiming Wedgebill. We found a flock of Crimson Chat (~20). White-plumed Honeyeater. Black-faced Woodswallow. Pied Honeyeater. Black-faced Cuckooshrike (subpallida).

We returned to the Great Northern Highway and headed for Mt Magnet. We stopped south of Lake Austin in the last good area of samphire. But nothing there. We continued south and found the windmill on the left side of the road at about 30kms north of Mt Magnet. We walked to the Western Bowerbird bower, but it had been trashed. Almost no birds in the area.

We drove back to Mt Magnet and did a recce of the Sandstone road for 20kms. The conditions were much better, and we planned to try there the next morning, but didn't need to.

Back at 17:15. Dinner at the Commercial Club Hotel at 18:15. Back by 19:20.

Day 4

Sun 19 Oct 2025 Mt Magnet to Yalgoo to Pindar to Geraldton.

We packed and departed at 05:50. Breakfast at the Swagman Roadhouse. We left at 06:20. We drove 5kms north to The Granites hoping for Copperback Quail-thrush and Hooded Robin. 17C.

We didn't find the quail-thrush at the main site, but we had excellent bird activity. Southern Whiteface (*castaneiventris*). Australian Zebra Finch. Hooded Robin (male). Black Honeyeater (male). Pied Honeyeater (female). Crimson Chat. Grey Shrikethrush. Crested Bellbird. Redthroat.

We drove up to the top of the cliff. COPPERBACK QUAIL-THRUSH (*clarum*)! A pair. Inland Thornbill. Yellow-rumped Thornbill (*chrysorrhoa*). Chestnut-rumped Thornbill.

We left at 08:20 with two Mulga Parrots near the entrance.

We drove back to Mt Magnet. Torresian Crow. Yellow-throated Miner. Laughing Dove. Magpie-lark. We then spent some time just to the south looking for rarities. Whistling Kite. Wedge-tailed Eagle.

At 09:00 we headed west towards Yalgoo (120km). We stopped at several sites. The conditions looked better than where we were yesterday, but the bird activity was very quiet. Splendid Fairywren. Slaty-backed Thornbill. Red-capped Robin (many females and finally a male). Crimson Chat. Pied Butcherbird. Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater. Yellow-throated Miner. Black-faced Woodswallow. Little Crow. Whistling Kite. Brown Falcon.

We arrived at Yalgoo at 11:15. 25C. We tried unsuccessfully for Chiming Wedgebill. We went to the dam. Red-backed Kingfisher. Little Black Cormorant. Diamond Dove.

We had lunch. Tree Martin. Little Crow. We left at 12:20. We headed west to Pindar (100km). We then drove 16km north past Tallering Station to a salt marsh. Cockatiel. We walked out and scanned. White-winged Fairywren. Crimson Chat. We walked out and found a pair of Orange Chat. We then headed back to the wreath *leschenaultia* site. We tried unsuccessfully for Copperback Quail-thrush. We heard Rainbow Bee-eater. We headed back to Pindar. More Cockatiel. Australian Hobby.

We continued west to Mullewa (30kms) and then to Geraldton (100kms). Stops for Emu. Pied Stilt. Red-necked Avocet. Grey Teal. Pacific Black Duck. Singing Honeyeater. Black-shouldered Kite.

There were several light showers as we got closer to Geraldton. The temperature dropped to 16C.

We refuelled and then checked in at the Ibis Styles at 17:00.

Day 5

Mon 20 Oct 2025 Kalbarri National Park.

Breakfast at 06:00. Silver Gull. We departed at 06:35. We headed north. Many Magpie-larks. Frank saw a Grey Currawong. We reached Northampton and continued. We passed the turnoff to Kalbarri and drove 14kms to the Galena Bridge that crosses the Murchison River. We arrived at 07:40. 16C.

The bird activity was excellent. White-winged Triller. Rufous Songlark. White-plumed Honeyeater. Brown Honeyeater. Little Black Cormorant. Peaceful Dove (clelandi). Fairy Martin. Mistletoebird. Brown Goshawk (fasciata). Little Pied Cormorant. Heard Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater, Rufous Whistler, Grey Shrikethrush and Crested Bellbird. Black-tailed Nativehen. Splendid Fairywren. Australian Zebra Finch. Black-faced Cuckooshrike (melanops). Silvereye. Black-fronted Dotterel. Red-capped Robin. Willie Wagtail. Pacific Black Duck. Australasian Shoveler flew past. Australasian Darter. Black Swan.

We left at 08:20 and drove back to the Kalbarri turnoff. We stopped briefly. Pallid Cuckoo. We continued reaching the park. We stopped several times trying for Western Fieldwren but no success. Indeed, while there were a lot of flowers there was very little activity. We did see Crimson Chat. Pied Honeyeater. White-cheeked Honeyeater (briefly). Little Eagle (dark morph). White-fronted Honeyeater.

We visited Hawk's Head and Ross Graham Lookout. Again, very little activity. Australasian Darter. Tree Martin. Welcome Swallow. 23C. There was now a stiff breeze making things even harder. A brief shower.

We tried a side road. Silveryeye. Frank pished in eight immature Red-capped Robins!

We reached Kalbarri. Nankeen Kestrel. Rufous Songlark calling. Emu with five young. We tried along the river. Again, very little. Australian White Ibis. We drove to the point. Australian Pelican. Silver Gull. Greater Crested Tern (~300). Pied Cormorant. We drove right to the point for a better look. Little Black Cormorant. Little Pied Cormorant. Ruddy Turnstone. Greater Sand Plover. Australian Pied Oystercatcher. Siberian Sand Plover. Sooty Oystercatcher (*fuliginosus*). Fairy Tern. Pacific Gull (*georgii*).

We had lunch at the Pelican Café. We then looked for the pelican, but it had gone. Osprey. We drove briefly around town but saw nothing different.

We drove out of town. Black Swan. Hoary-headed Grebe. White-necked heron. Little Eagle (dark morph again).

We drove to Port Gregory and the salt works, and the Pink Lake. Very little, but we did see Common Greenshank, Banded Stilt and Ruddy Turnstone. We drove to the lookout over the ocean. Osprey. Pacific Gull. Australian Pied Oystercatcher.

We drove to Northampton. White-fronted Chat. Galah. We went through Geraldton to the port area. Adult Pacific Gull. Fairy Tern.

We returned to the hotel at 16:20.

Day 6

Tue 21 Oct 2025 Geraldton to Perth.

An excellent breakfast at 06:00. Silver Gull. We departed at 06:40. 14C. We headed south on Brand Highway to Dongara. Emu. White-faced Heron. We continued and turned on to Indian Ocean Drive. Western Grey Kangaroo.

We stopped at the coast in Leeman. Silver Gull. Pacific Gull. Great Crested Tern. Australian Pied Cormorant. Australian Hobby (*longipennis*). Australian Pelican. White-winged Fairywren.

We stopped at the beach in Jurien Bay. Australian Pied Oystercatcher. Pacific Gull. White-bellied Sea Eagle. Frank saw two dark morph Pacific Reef Heron fly behind the island.

We continued to Cervantes. A stop on the way produced Western Fieldwren. Wood Sandpiper. We went to Lake Thetis to see the stromatolites. Red-capped Plover. Red-necked Stint. Pied Stilt. Common Greenshank. Hoary-headed Grebe. White-necked Heron. A surprise was White-breasted Robin in the car park. Silvereye.

We continued to Lancelin. 21C. We went to the north end of town and scanned Lancelin Island offshore. The birds were distant. Brown Noddy. Bridled Tern. Great Crested Tern. Roseate Tern (*dougalli*).

We had lunch at the tavern. We departed at 13:00. We stopped near Yanchep NP but saw nothing. We stopped at the Moore River. Western Corella (~300 before we got there). Rufous Whistler.

We then went to the Herdsman Lake Wildlife Centre. Hardhead. Great Crested Grebe. Dusky Moorhen. Black Swan. Pacific Black Duck. Maned Duck. Pink-eared Duck (with ducklings). Straw-necked Ibis flew by. Little Pied Cormorant. We walked along the boardwalk. Australasian Shoveler. Australian Reed Warbler. Great Egret (*modesta*). Swamp Harrier. Eurasian Coot. Maned Duck. Rainbow Lorikeet (introduced).

We drove around to Moondine Drive. Tawny Frogmouth (with chicks). Australian Swamphen. Grey Teal. Buff-banded Rail. Australian White Ibis. Black Swan. Musk Duck.

We drove to the west side of Lake Monger. Australian Shelduck (large numbers). Australian Pelican. Maned Duck. Little Corella (introduced).

We then drove to the Ingot Hotel arriving at 16:55.
